



Laura Margaret Simpson Lawless was a 1979 graduate of Poteau High School. She was born in Tennessee and moved to Poteau in 1971, entering the Poteau School system. Laura was active in band, playing the clarinet, and had several band directors over the years – Mr. Lusk, Mr. Huckabee, Mr. Grass, Mr. Fezekas, and Mr. Brence. She was active in the Katty Club, journalism and was Editor of the Potonian staff. A member of the Student Council and Honor Society, Laura graduated in 1979 as Co-Valedictorian of her class. She was a member of Poteau First Baptist Church while living in Poteau and sang in a group called "In Jesus Name".

After graduation, she went to NSU and received a BS in Math Education, then a Masters in Education. Laura married Jeff Lawless in 1981. She taught math at Bartlesville Mid High, Owasso Schools, Dove Science Academy,

She was named Teacher of the Year at the Early College High School in Broken Arrow, for the 2021-22 school year.

Laura attended many PHS reunions and always loved seeing her Poteau High School "family". She was loved by her classmates and kept track of them long after graduation. Laura was a faithful "Potonian".

When Laura was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer, she fought the good fight, inspiring many with her faith in God and her courage in the face of adversity. She passed away on December 6, 2023, after a 20-month battle with cancer.

Alumni Financial News by Linda Holton, Class of 1956

Since the reunion we have received, and are grateful for, several donations. Carolyn Becker donated \$1,000 in memory of her Class of 1959. Leta Wann donated \$25. The Class of 1960 donated \$157. A member of the Class of 1985 is making a monthly \$100 donation. Thanks to Willie Morris, the Poteau DAV Chapter is donating \$300 for caps and gowns.

Speaking of finances, or the lack of them. The report shows we have a lot of money, but most of that is not for general Association expenses. We spent over \$5,000 for the 2023 reunion. The biggest expense was the meal. A lot of people registered but were unable to attend. The meal expense was based on the number of registrations. So, it was a fixed expense for 300 people registered, yet only 174 meals were served, and 126 meals were purchased but not served.

All revenue received is either donations or dues to become an active alumni member. (Yes, you can be an alumnus without being an active alumnus.) Both of those sources of revenue have all but stopped. To pay for the reunion in 2025, we will either need additional funds (if we want to cover the full cost) or charge a fee to attend. The Association has expenses just like you do. We sponsor caps & gowns for a few graduating seniors, post office box rental, hosting the website, and the reunion – to name just a few. If we don't have enough revenue to cover our expenses, we may have to discontinue some of them.

Please consider donating or becoming an active alumni member. Dues are \$40 (one-time only) for a lifetime membership. Or donate any amount that you prefer.

Did you work on the Potonian yearbook or Pirate Log newsletter in high school? Why were you interested or motivated to participate? I suppose the writing, publishing, and journalism bug bit me early. What I didn't count on was also being bitten by the advertising bug.

Our teacher sponsor, Mrs. Janell Darneal, was a major reason we wanted to be in the class. She was popular because students appreciated her teaching style and personality, a real bright light of the PHS faculty. My official designation in the class was a photographer. Mrs. Darneal allowed me, and the rest of the students, to be involved in every aspect of writing, layout, production, and advertising sponsor sales. Being a floater, involved in multiple tasks, defined my career choices for decades.

My fellow students on the Potonian and Pirate Log for the 71/72 school year were another reason I enjoyed being part of it. I was not one of the "cool or brainy kids" back in the day. The group was made up of both.

Although we attended the same school, I didn't know the others on the Potonian staff very well. For advertising sponsor sales, we were paired with other students to call on businesses with ads in previous Potonians and contact other businesses for new ads. This was a good opportunity to get to know our classmates better. Plus, my early experience cold-calling businesses for advertising shaped and benefitted my career choices.

I don't remember the cost of yearbooks in the late 1960s and early 70s. It couldn't have been more than \$20. Parents and grandparents of current middle school and high school students tell me yearbooks cost north of \$50.

I'm lucky to still have the 1968 through 1973 Potonians. Sometimes I go years without looking at them and other times one or more is on the corner of my desk, too often due to a death. I don't go to Poteau often but do what I can to support the Alumni Association.
